# ESCP Celebrates Ten Years of Progressive Development



ESCP celebrates its 10th year in 2015, leading up to the 10th anniversary in January 2016 since the Society was formed by the merging of EACP and ECCP.

Since then, many have contributed in various ways to bring about the success of the ESCP that we see today. The ESCP Executive Committee would like to thank every member for supporting the Society, and particularly those who have served on Committees and represented the Society at a national and international level.

## ESCP's Achievements

#### ESCP's annual scientific meeting:

- Now widely regarded both in Europe and internationally, as one of the leading colorectal meetings in the world, with increasing diversity and contributions from international visiting speakers
- Through financially successful annual meetings, the Society is on a firm footing enabling it to provide wider educational opportunities in the years to come

# Significant developments in relations with key affiliate organisations, including:

- ESSO: reciprocal membership agreement established whereby ESCP members automatically have membership of ESSO
- ESGAR: ESCP now co-hosts a radiology workshop each year with ESGAR which started in 2013 and continues in December 2014 (12-13 December 2014, Lisbon)
- Tripartite: ESCP was joint-organiser in 2014 of the Tripartite Colorectal Meeting in Birmingham, July 2014 which was highly rated by attendees
- S-ECCO: ESCP now endorses S-ECCO's
  Masterclass at the annual ECCO meeting, this
  collaboration began in February 2014 and
  will continue
- UEG: ESCP is represented on UEG committees (Education, Scientific, General Assembly)
- International relationships with other Societies have been formed, including ASCRS (USA) and the Japanese Colorectal

Society, both supporting reciprocal Travelling Fellowships to each other's annual meeting

## Enhanced conference programme and opportunities for Young Surgeons:

- The introduction of a 3rd parallel stream of innovative workshops at the 2014 conference
- A steady programme of three months' fellowships began in 2012, and has continued now for three years with support over that period from both Medtronic and Covidien; the ESCP Executive has made a firm commitment to underwriting ten fellowships each year
- Through online resources, ESCP is building a wealth of information available in its new website member-area; this now includes cooperation with Springer, publisher of the European Manual of Coloproctology so that ESCP members can access the book online free of charge

#### **Research and Trials:**

- Broadened activity through ESCP's Research Committee, with involvement in pan-European trials and cohort studies
- Involvement with other societies (ESSO, S-ECCO for example) working on the development of best practice guidelines
- Successful research and trials session at the annual conference
- An established fund to enable the internationalisation of clinical trials
