COURSE OVERVIEW

This course (workshop) is intended for general and colorectal surgeons with interest and/or experience in laparoscopic colon resections. The intensive one-day course will provide participants with an opportunity to participate in didactic sessions and hands-on instruction using human cadavers.



THIS COURSE WILL EMPHASIZE

- Colorectal anatomy as it relates to laparoscopic resection
- Oncologic principles of laparoscopic colorectal resection
- Bowel mobilization and devascularization
- Extracorporeal and intracorporeal anastomoses
- Laparoscopic repair of parastomal hernia with mesh
- Adhesion prevention
- Hand-assisted technique for lower anterior resection

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Identify indications for laparoscopic surgery for benign and malignant colorectal diseases.
- Demonstrate skills and techniques necessary for mesh repair of parastomal hernia.
- Demonstrate techniques for laparoscopic intracorporeal anastomoses.
- Demonstrate skills in hand-assisted colorectal surgery.
- Demonstrate techniques in adhesion prevention.
