

Hands-On Cadaver Training in Laparoscopic Colon and Rectal Surgery, Abdominal Wall Reconstruction and Colonoscopic Stenting of Strictures

Friday, March 22, 2013

This hands-on training is intended for general and colorectal surgeons and gastroenterologists with an interest in laparoscopic colon resections and the utilization of biologic grafts for abdominal wall and parastomal hernia repair and endoscopic colon stenting of strictures.

Training Objectives

- Identify indications for laparoscopic/LESS/HALS surgery for colorectal diseases.
- Demonstrate technique for TAMIS
- Demonstrate procedures in conventional APR (Abdominal Perineal Resection).
- Demonstrate techniques for parastomal hernia repair using biologic grafts.
- Differentiate between the various biologic grafts available.
- Demonstrate skills necessary for component separation in abdominal wall reconstruction.
- Discuss self-expanding metal stent to alleviate colonic obstruction
- Demonstrate techniques for mesh fixation and abdominal wall closure using MonoMax a new long-term absorbable suture specially engineered for abdominal wall closure.
