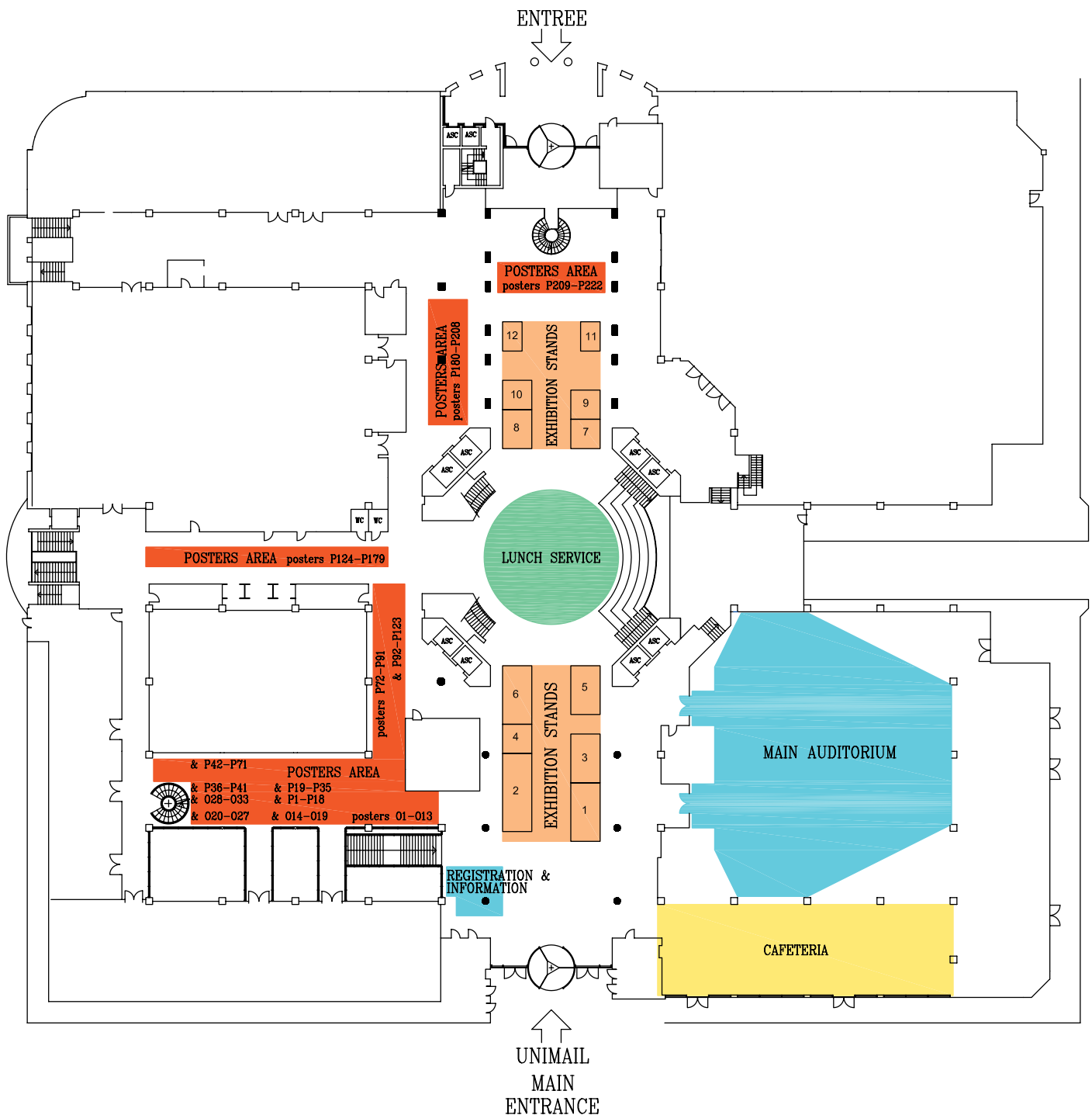

Bus and tramway tickets must be purchased before boarding the vehicle, which are available from vending machines located at all bus or tramway stops. Tram no. 13 leaves from various stops located in the city centre and stops near Uni Mail (stop 'Pont-d'Arve' and it is a one-zone ride).


